AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES (AIS)

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) are plants and animals that live in water. They have the potential to cause economic, environmental or human health damage, and have a negative impact on the waterway.



As responsible boaters and citizens, every boat owner should do his or her part to prevent the spread of invasive species. In many cases, the law requires it too. Check local regulations for any waterway where you're boating.

After every boating trip, follow three simple steps before leaving access to the water to stop the spread of aquatic invasive species (AIS): clean, drain, dry.

It's up to the boater to protect the environment from the damage that aquatic invasive species (AIS) can cause..

CLEANING

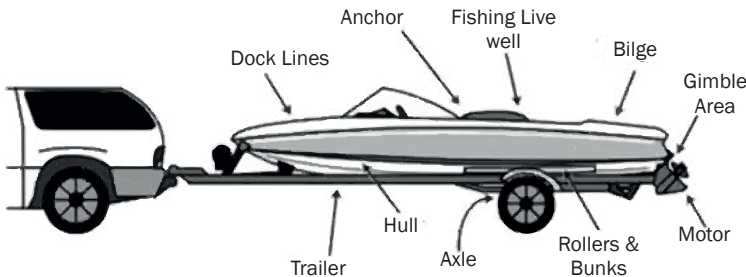
Inspect and remove all aquatic plants, animals, mud and debris from boat, motor, trailer, anchor and all water sports equipment. Rinse, scrub or wash, as appropriate, away from storm drains, ditches or waterways. Rinse boat and trailer with hot water, if possible. Rinse motor in accordance with owner's manual.

DRY OUT:

Allow the boat to dry completely before sailing again.

DEALERS

Your dealer will inspect your boat when you take delivery to ensure that it is in perfect condition and that all components are working properly. Your dealer will discuss the terms of all warranties and stress the importance of renewing each warranty with the manufacturer. He will also explain the appropriate procedures for obtaining warranty service. On request, he will also provide information on the operation of the boat and its systems and components.



Note : Some localities may require inspection or decontamination before and/or after launching. Check state/provincial or local laws and regulations for requirements prior to traveling to go boating..
